**Item Title: Amendment to Roselle Liquor Ordinance – Increase Class U-
Decrease Class E**

VILLAGE BOARD ACTION

Pass an ordinance amending the “Code of Ordinances, Village of Roselle, Illinois” limitation on the number of licenses covering the sale of alcoholic liquors in the Village of Roselle to increase the number of Class “U” Licenses from 0 to 1 and decrease Class “E” Licenses from 2 to 1 for Pollyanna Brewing Co.

Executive Summary:

As discussed at the June 14, 2021 Village Board meeting, there is a need to add a new classification to the Liquor Code. This will be a Class U to allow for wineries and breweries to also make and sell spirits. Pollyanna, Brewing Co. who is currently operating under a Roselle E Class license, which does not allow for spirits, will be changing over to a U license with the approval of this ordinance.

This ordinance will update the Liquor Code to reflect the number of Class U and Class E licenses issued.

ORDINANCE NO. 2021-

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE
“CODE OF ORDINANCES, VILLAGE OF ROSELLE, ILLINOIS” LIMITATION ON
NUMBER OF LICENSES COVERING THE SALE OF ALCOHOLIC LIQUORS IN THE
VILLAGE OF ROSELLE**

BE IT ORDAINED BY the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Roselle, DuPage and Cook Counties, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1: That the “Code of Ordinances, Village of Roselle, Illinois,” Chapter 3 entitled, “Alcoholic Beverages, Section 3-33, Limitation on number of Licenses” shall be amended as follows:

Decrease the number of Class “E” Licenses from 2 to 1
Increase the number of Class “U” Licenses from 0 to 1
Pollyanna Brewing Co. 245 E Main St. Roselle

SECTION 2: That all parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 3: Should any court of competent jurisdiction find any portion of this ordinance to be legally invalid; such partial invalidity shall not affect the remainder of the ordinance.

SECTION 4: That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and publication in pamphlet form.
