Item Title: Police Pistol Surplus Property Sale

OLD BUSINESS

VILLAGE BOARD ACTION:

Pass an ordinance authorizing the disposition of personal property of the Village of Roselle, Illinois.

Executive Summary:

In December 2020 the Village Board approved the purchase of new Glock Model 45 MOS sidearms for the police department. The sidearms purchased in 2020 replaced the police department’s Glock Model 21SF sidearms. The department has no need for the Glock Model 21SF sidearms for training or other related purposes, therefore staff recommends the transfer and sale of the forty (40) Glock Model 21SF sidearms that remain in the police department’s inventory.

Staff requested bids from four different Federal Firearms Licensees (FFL) and received bids from three of the of the FFLs as follows:

Vendor	Purchase Price
Keisler Police Supply Company	\$11,600
MOA Industries	\$11,200
Ray O’Herron	\$11,000

Staff recommends the transfer and sale of the sidearms to the highest bidder, Keisler Police Supply Company.

**AN ORDINANCE
AUTHORIZING THE DISPOSITION OF
PERSONAL PROPERTY OF
THE VILLAGE OF ROSELLE, ILLINOIS**

WHEREAS, the Village of Roselle (hereinafter referred to as the "Village") is an Illinois Municipal Corporation organized pursuant to the laws of the State of Illinois;

WHEREAS, the Village has the authority to adopt ordinances and to promulgate rules and regulations that pertain to its government and affairs that protect the health, safety and welfare of its residents;

WHEREAS, Chapter 65 Section 5/11-76-4 of the Illinois Compiled Statutes provides that whenever a village owns any personal property that in the opinion of Board of Trustees then holding office is no longer necessary or useful to, or for the best interests of the village, at any regular meeting or at any special meeting called for that purpose, by ordinance, may authorize the conveyance or sale of that personal property in any manner that they may designate, with or without advertising the sale;

WHEREAS, the Police Department will from time to time make assessments to the current needs of the department that may change from time to time;

WHEREAS, the Police Department has elected to change and update its designated firearm and is desirous of disposing of the older versions of the firearms;

WHEREAS, it is prudent that in the event that such surplus property is firearms that the transfer of such firearms is best served by transferring the items to duly licensed firearms dealer or law enforcement agency;

WHEREAS, it is the opinion of the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Roselle that the personal property referenced herein is no longer necessary, useful or in the best interests for the Village to retain ownership of said personal property; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have determined that the personal property described herein should be disposed of in a manner as provided for and pursuant to this ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, in open meeting assembled, by the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Roselle, Cook and DuPage Counties, Illinois as follows:

Section One - Recitals

The Board of Trustees hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preamble to this ordinance are full, true and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this ordinance as legislative findings.

Section Two – Authorization to Dispose of Personal Property

The personal property set forth in Exhibit A which is attached hereto and made a part hereof is/are no longer necessary or useful to, or for the best interests of the Village of Roselle.

Section Three – Authorization and Direction

The Village Administrator or his designee is hereby authorized and directed to dispose of the personal property set forth in Exhibit A in a manner as the Village Administrator shall determine is in the best interests of the Village of Roselle. The personal property described herein must be sold or disposed of in an “as is” condition.

Section Four – Other Actions Authorized

The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village shall take all actions necessary or reasonably required to carry out and give effect to the intent of this ordinance and otherwise to consummate the transactions contemplated herein and shall take all actions necessary in conformity therewith including, without limitation, the execution and delivery of all documents required to be delivered in connection with the transaction contemplated herein.

Section Five – Acts of Village Officials

That all past, present and future acts and doings of the officials of the Village that are in conformity with the purpose and intent of this ordinance are hereby, in all respects, ratified, approved, authorized and confirmed.

Section Six – Conflict Clause

That all ordinances, parts of ordinances, resolutions, parts of resolutions or board actions in conflict with the terms of this ordinance shall be repealed to the extent of said conflict.

Section Seven – Passage Clause

That this ordinance shall take full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

Section Eight – Constitutionality Clause

Any part or parts of this ordinance declared by a court of law to be invalid or unconstitutional shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this ordinance.

Section Nine – Publication

This ordinance shall be published in book or pamphlet form as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code.

Section Ten – Recording

This ordinance shall be entered into the minutes and upon the journals of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Roselle.
